DARRELL BIDDLESTONE - MEMBER SINCE 2022

I joined the Club in 2022. My first car was 1962 Corvair Monza Coupe. My Father paid \$50.00 for it when I was a senior at Allen East high school in Lafayette Ohio. My nickname was Corvair Man. After graduation I enlisted in the Air Force and married my wife Debbie. After basic training I was stationed at



Seymour Johnson Air Force Base in Goldsboro NC in 1972 and later went into the Air National Guard in Springfield, Ohio. While in the National Guard I worked at Shraders, Inc. retreading giant earth moving tires for ten years.

In 1981 my wife started a consignment store in Greenville, Ohio and I soon left the factory to work for her. We branched out into used furniture and appliances. Two years later branching out in another store selling new furniture.

While in the national guard, my neighbor had a 1965 Corsa Coupe 140hp 4 speed. I bought it for \$165.00 in 1976. After that the bug bit me. I bought a 1966 140 Monza, a 1964 Greenbrier van, 1967 Monza convertible and I didn't keep any of these except for parts.

In 2022 I bought my 1965 180 turbo Corsa 4speed at Mecum auction in Kissimmee, Florida. I went almost 40 years without owning a Corvair.

I am currently working on a 1966 Monza Coupe with a 140 hp automatic. The engine for my current project is out of my original 1965 Corsa 140. I sold the car in 1985 and the buyer did not want the 140 so I took it out and put it into my warehouse where it sat for 40 years. When Gary and Shawn Funkhouser get it finished it will go into my current project 1966 Monza.

Other cars in my collection are 1915 Ford Model T Brass Touring, 1917 Model T Speedster, 1923 Model T Doctors Coupe, 1930 Model A deluxe coupe and a 2002 Ford Thunderbird.

I consider all my cars everyday drivers and enjoy sharing them with the public. I have given several 100 year old people a birthday ride in a 100 year old car. I have been blessed to be able to share what I have with others and I have enjoyed being part of the Corvair family.




- NEW MEMBER PROFILE -

MIKE MAGEE - MEMBER SINCE WHEN?

I would like to thank everyone in the club for allowing me to become a member again; I was briefly a member of this chapter in the early/mid 70s.

I spent my early childhood on my grandfather's farm in Miami County, went to high school in Miamisburg, college at WSU & UD and presently live in Huber Heights. I married my wife Susan who early in our 48 years together accommodated my serious addiction to cars (doesn't everyone have at least eight cars in their driveway?) and in particular my obsessive compulsive Corvair disorder (OCCD).

I was 17 in early 1966 when my older brother gave me his Corvair. It was a 62 convertible 4 spd 102. This was my first true love affair with a car and I really liked the way that rear engine car handled, but after a year I purchased a 1965 turbo to autocross and my passion for Corvairs exploded. Over the next ten years I bought/sold/parted & accumulated another 34 Corvairs. I had a wide variety but I was particularly enamored with the turbo cars. The concept of essentially free horsepower from turbocharging and its long development history was intriguing so much so that I spent months researching it for my senior year thesis. That Corvair life episode ended when the building I worked out of was sold and life in general precluded my OCCD for decades.

This subdermal disease has smoldered in me for a half century and finally has reemerged with impetus and I am on the hunt for my next Corvair. I spent ten days at this year's convention in California looking for that ideal affordable car to no avail. Surely my next Corvair is just around the corner however, as we all know Corvairs are like potato chips, you can't have just one.

TECH TIPS

CORVAIR FRESH AIR HEATER HOSE

Corvair Center poster Chris 12 has a bad fresh air hose on his 1965 turbo Corvair and says the manual isn't much help on how to replace it.

Poster Jim Brandenberg replies that it is difficult to feed the new hose through the firewall and that they tear easily and are expensive. He also mentions that on turbo cars the oval duct on the left side is riveted to the shroud unlike non turbo cars.

Well known poster and Corvair mechanic, Dave Motohead, says that he blocks off the duct on the shroud and the firewall and mounts a K&N air filter to the fresh air inlet to the heater. More importantly, Dave says that you don't want a bad fresh air hose as you will lose your cooling air over cylinder #5 and dropped valve seats are very common. Dave reiterates that blocking off the fresh air duct on the top shroud is good for any Corvair engine period. Dave says he does this to all the cars he works on.

Well know poster, Rex Johnson, says that he blocks off the fresh air vents on all his Corvairs. He does it by slipping the end of the hose at the shroud over several layers of aluminum foil. Rex says his heater always works well with the fresh air blocked off.





GAS LINE SEALER

Your editor had to replace the leaking fuel pump on his V-8 Corvair. The replacement pump was not an exact copy of the pump that was removed. This required some rework of the fuel lines. The connection at the pump and the other pieces were the tapered thread type and they kept leaking even though they were very tight. One suggestion was to use Teflon tape as one friend does. Another car friend does not like the Teflon idea as bits of the Teflon can come off and clog passage ways in the carburetor. He proposed using a gas resistant sealer that comes in a tube. The sealer in the tube was used with good success. The fittings are no longer leaking. The tube sealer is LEAK LOCK made by Highside Chemicals Inc. (www.highsidechem.com). It is available on Amazon in a 1.33 oz blue tube, Part No# HS10001. Use vinyl gloves as the only thing that will remove it from your fingers is acetone.




