HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This article is an edited version of a Hemmings Motor News article about the last Corvair built. For the entire article and several comments from Corvair enthusiasts use the link in the "Credits" below.

Half A Century Later, The Fate Of The Last Corvair Ever Built Remains Unknown by Daniel Strohl Feb 11, 2019. In the months leading up to the final day of production for the Chevrolet Corvair, General Motors fielded calls from dealers, executives, and VIPs requesting a chance to buy the very last Corvair. Thus the scheduled final production day for the Corvair — May 14, 1969 — drew national media attention. The very last of the 6,000 scheduled 1969 Corvairs, an Olympic Gold Monza coupe fitted with a 95-hp engine, Powerglide automatic transmission, pushbutton radio, tinted glass, whitewall tires, door edge guards, custom deluxe seat belts, electric clock, remote control rearview mirror and rear window defogger rolled out of the Willow Run Assembly Plant. It carried a serial number of 105379W706000. However, as the press filed out of the Willow Run plant, workers rolled that Olympic Gold coupe away, into one of automotive history's most enduring mysteries.

The Corvair #6000 had originally been ordered by one of the world's legendary car collectors, Bill Harrah. Tacoma-based Chevrolet dealer John Wallerich placed the order for Harrah on April 1st for the very last VIN. Later, former GM executive vice president Harold Boyer placed an order for the last Corvair. By May 12, Chevrolet executives decided to keep #6000. They arranged to give #5999, a LeMans Blue Monza coupe to Boyer and #5968 to Harrah along with a second, much earlier, Corvair (#5606). So what happened to #6000? One oft-repeated tale has a mysterious van picking up #6000 and spiriting it away from Willow Run. Another has it going to an unnamed GM director or

vice president. Most Willow Run people said #6000 got scrapped, though by whose order or when or where nobody seems able to answer.

About 10 to 20 fully assembled Corvairs remained at the plant after the last day of production. These were set aside for internal GM use and possible lawsuits and government investigations. So, #6000 might have been one of these and one of these was later given to GM President Ed Cole. The last one of this Corvair group, a Forest Green 500 coupe with a serial number that ended in 5214, went to auction in March 1975 and later appeared for sale in Hemmings Motor News advertised, misleadingly, as "the last one ever produced."

Over the years, several other late-production Corvairs have popped up onto Corvair collectors' radar. Boyer's #5999 now resides in the Corvair Museum in Decatur, Illinois, as does #5997, the last Corvair convertible produced, and an unnumbered Fisher body shell produced after #6000's body shell but never assembled into a complete car. A number of other late-build Corvairs (among them #5996, #5995, #5994, #5989, #5988, and #5984) have been documented by the Corvair Society of America, though #5998 remains in the wind, as does any documented evidence as to the fate of #6000.




CORVAIR EXPOSED ON CLOTHING CATALOG


Club member Greg Leingang sent these pictures in. His subscription to Lands' End Men clothing catalog shows some models posing with a sexy looking Corvair. The

AUTOZONE RARE PARTS

Autozone has a list of rare parts and sometimes one can hit paydirt. Case in point. I needed a steering connecting rod for my 1961 shorty Rampside. The current one just looked a little worn and no one wants to be in a FC that can't be steered. This is the part that connects the Pitman arm on the steering box to the relay arm (commonly called the "boomerang" in FC speak). One end is 15" long and the other is a typical short tie rod end connected by an adjusting sleeve. Clark's no longer has the longer end of this rod. They have available a substitute longer adjusting sleeve and use two regular short tie rod ends. The 2020 price of the substitute sleeve and two end tie rod ends is \$270 plus shipping. Autozone did have the longer tie rod end for \$90 and \$30 for the short end. The long end was a right hand thread so I had to make sure the short end I ordered was a left hand thread. I did not come up with this on my own. The tip came from one of the posters at Corvair Center.

FINDING A TECH TOPIC ON CORVAIR CENTER

One of the posters on Corvair Center related that it is easier to find the topic by going through Google than using the search site on Corvair Center. Go to google and ask for a specific topic on Corvair Center. This is akin to having a librarian look up the topic you are trying to find while at the library.

Directions to the club meeting

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available.
