HISTORY HAPPENS

CORVAIRS BY PONTIAC AND OLDSMOBILE

When the Corvair was invisioned GM managment wanted Olds and Pontiac to have a rear engined car to help spread the development cost. The designers came up with designs for the cars but got a lot of push back from the Olds and Pontiac divisions. One big hurdle was the engine. Neither Olds or Pontiac had an aircooled engine and in those days each division was pretty much autonomous. They did not want to use a Chevy engine in their cars. Remember what happened in the 70 or 80s when Olds buyers found out they actually had a Chevy engine in their cars, not a "Rocket" Olds. So in the end they did not build a rear engine car but they did build the small Olds F-85 and the Pontiac Lemans. The discussions on a rear engine may have led Pontiac to install a rear transaxle in the Lemans. Remember the "rope" drive shaft that ran below the floor to connect the engine in the front to the transaxle in the rear to allow for a flat floor like a Corvair? While Olds never came out with a rear engine some of us ended up putting the Olds (or Buick) 215 C.I. engine in our Corvairs. Maybe that is the way they could have had a rear engine. Sorry, we can't show photos of the Olds and Pontiac cars as they are copyrighted. You can google them if you want to see what they looked like.

ONGOING ALTERNATOR PROBLEMS

If your alternator keeps going bad, check to see if the alternator has the correct cooling fan on it. Corvair engines turn the opposite direction from front wheel drive cars. Cooling fans on alternators do not scoop air into them, they pull it through the alternator. They centrifugally expell air out the perimeter of the fan and pull it in on the back side of the fan.

WINDOW CORVAN?

Normally an FC with windows is a Greenbriar. An FC without windows is a Corvan. One of the posters on Corvair Center recently purchased what he calls a window Corvan. He said he thought it was a Greenbriar until he looked at the body tag. Did it come from the factory that way or did someone do a conversion? What would be the advantage of doing a conversion?

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Directions to the club meeting at:

Vandalia Justice Center -

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. Note: The room is on the west side of the building. If some of the club members are already there you may be able to enter through the side door to the room. They can let you in or may have the door blocked open.

Vandalia Historical Society Meeting House/Shelter -

It is only 2 minutes from the Justice Center. It is located at 336 East Alkaline Springs Road. From the Justice Center (or I-75) drive west on National Road to the Dixie Drive Highway intersection. Turn left (south) onto Dixie Drive and continue on Dixie to the stoplight at Elva Court then continue on Dixie to the next street on your left (just past the Vandalia-Butler High School), and turn left (east) onto East Alkaline Springs Road. You will see the City Art Park on your right and just past the park is a long wood picket fence in front of the Society property. Turn right into the driveway and drive back around the barn to the parking area and the Meeting House / Shelter. There are restrooms in the Meeting House if needed. It would be a good idea to bring your mask for that additional step of protection. We are on the web!
