










Communique and President of the Impala club. We had a discussion on several topics including which Corsa events cannot be combined with the Impala events. The Welcome Party/Car Display occurring at the same time will be held jointly with both clubs. The indoor and outdoor swap meet can be combined. They are interested in our dinner tour to the AF Museum. They can be in our rally but have their own personnel from start to finish and at any checkpoints. They can use the same route, but they will have to use a different gas station if participating in an Econo-Run. They are planning a cruise-in in Tipp City and would be inviting us to go. A detailed map of the hotel



parking lot proved to be very useful showing where the Corvairs and Impalas could park and stay separated. We now have a spreadsheet acting as a guide for both clubs to follow. Having both the Impala and Corvair club at the same location for their convention is unprecedented. There will be challenges but the CORSA convention will remain as a Corvair convention and will be operated as such and is separate from the Impala convention. They are a much smaller group.

At our Corvairborne meeting, with all quotes available, we looked at the total cost for hosting a dinner tour at the AF Museum. Adding the museum rental, catering, busing, and alcohol, the cost per person was somewhat a little high but reasonable. We decided to ditch the bus and have a caravan to the museum which would be more fun. The savings can go toward pricier food item or help lower the registration fee. We also decided on the best option for beer and wine. Depending on a number of registrants, we may hire a second bartender. We will go over the menu and choose the best option for food.

The Hospitality is on track with the planning. Their job is to keep replenishing the snacks and drinks and sell 50/50 tickets several times daily. They are suggesting all three clubs provide at least three gift baskets for a raffle. It does take a lot of work and could use a few more volunteers. They must stay organize not just for one day but every day during the convention week.

Remembering how at the Oldsmobile convention they had blocked entrances around the main parking lot keeping non-show cars and trailers out, we pulled up a map and pointed out those locations. A barrier would be needed along the entire length of one parking lot to control traffic. We may have a solution for that. We are still looking for at least one person to sign up and take charge of Parking. That person would recruit fellow club members to help. The Impala club could help in this area but they should manage their own parking. It should be a fun job. A detailed map will be created showing where and which signs to place, for setting up pop-up tents, and for porta-johns. It is advisable to set up all signs the day before the first day of the convention.

There were personal discussions among club members. One was on potential sponsors. If we find sponsors who would help support the cost of the food and use of the AF Museum, and per-haps the Autocross, and any other tours we may have, they could be recognized in our program and on admission tickets. As an incentive, their logo could be printed on a large banner and displayed where we are able, then given to them after our convention. We will come up with a package for sponsors and advertisers.

Another idea being explored were inviting the Vairplanes to come. We are still working if they could land at either near the AF Museum, the Dayton Wright Brothers Airport, or Moraine Air Park. We are also looking into the possibility for a photo shoot with some of these planes with your Corvair on the runway. The OshKosh Fly-In in Wisconsin and our convention is the same week making this event unlikely to happen. We can look into inviting the Shriner displaying the Monza Juniors. They have dozens of them. Carl Kelsen from Australia would like to show his presentation and he is welcome to.

At the Dayton Concours d'Elegance, we met with Kristina from the Packard Museum, Pete from the British Transportation Museum, and Laura from Carillon Park. We met Steve at the Wright B Flyer Museum a day earlier. It was a good weekend getting all our questions answered. Steve agreed he will bring the half scale Wright B Flyer to our convention site but he was concerned about leaving it outside all week. There isn't any place at the hotel to display it indoor. I suggested

he just bring it for one day. Pete agreed he will bring or tow the Sunbeam Imp to the host hotel. He doesn't mind leaving it all week. Then an idea struck. Asking Kristina if she could bring a Packard to the convention, we could place all three vehicles as a centerpiece at our Welcome Party. Signs could be made as an invitation to visit their museum. Also it could be showcased the same way the next day at our Concours at Carillon Park. The hotel offers free shuttle service to the Packard and British Museum and anyone can go there as they wish rather than having a planned event. The Packard Museum do offer their museum for an evening social so we'll look into that.

It would be nice to find a sponsor who could help support a flyover at our Concours. A replica of a Wright B Flyer would fly at 1000ft and make three passes directly overhead at the park. What a great way to show support.

The replica is housed at the Wright B Flyer Museum. They are short on volunteers and close at noon on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. If we have volunteers to man the museum, they will keep the doors open longer for our quest to visit.

Finally, the Corsa convention committee announced they will be visiting Dayton. Upon their arrival, they will be given a tour at every site we will have for the convention. They will review the host hotel parking area, then to Carillon Park where the Concours will be. Then they will see the Packard Museum. If they can remain open during our visit, we'll take a peek at the Sunbeam Imp at the British Transportation Museum, and Kil-Kare where our autocross might be. If time permits, we'll try visiting the Wright B Flyer Museum after we see the AF Museum.

SAVING A/C REFRIGERANT R-12

Still using R-12 in your Corvair with A/C? Don't want to switch to R-134A and you still have some R-12 on hand and need to have the system repaired? Note that a good A/C mechanic has a machine that can fill the system with R-134A after a repair to check for leaks. After the check, if the system is leak free, the machine can take the R-134A back out and the system can be filled with your precious R-12 rather than wasting the R-12 to make check and no R-134A was wasted in the test if there were no leaks.

Directions to the club meeting at:

Vandalia Justice Center -

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. Note: The room is on the west side of the building. If some of the club members are already there you may be able to enter through the side door to the room. They can let you in or may have the door blocked open.

Vandalia Historical Society Meeting House/Shelter -

It is only 2 minutes from the Justice Center. It is located at 336 East Alkaline Springs Road. From the Justice Center (or I-75) drive west on National Road to the Dixie Drive Highway intersection. Turn left (south) onto Dixie Drive and continue on Dixie to the stoplight at Elva Court then continue on Dixie to the next street on your left (just past the Vandalia-Butler High School), and turn left (east) onto East Alkaline Springs Road. You will see the City Art Park on your right and just past the park is a long wood picket fence in front of the Society property. Turn right into the driveway and drive back around the barn to the parking area and the Meeting House / Shelter. There are restrooms in the Meeting House if needed. It would be a good idea to bring your mask for that additional step of protection.
