
MAY ACTIVITY

A few who attended the D&D Classic Tour could not stay for lunch. As usual, the D&D Classic tour was very enjoyable, interesting and educational. Our friend and tour guide Mike Ison was full of interesting facts and stories and everyone seemed to enjoy and appreciate the tour of the various buildings. We started close to 10:05AM and finished about 11:25AM. We told the staff at Buffalo Jacks we would be over about 11:45am, so we were a little early but they were ready for us. We had the room to ourselves so we spread out into several tables for comfort and it was easy to hear whoever wanted to share information about the tour or the meeting.

It was noted by Joe that we approved a motion via Email to make a \$50 donation to the Fisher House Foundation for the cruise-in D&D sponsors in May. HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This article is Part one from the website "www.stresslesscamping.com." You can find a lot more than our condensed article at the website of Peggy and Tony Barthel. THE CHEVROLET CORVAIR AS A CAMPER

The Corvair also has a history in the world of camping. The vans and pickups, in the Corvair line from 1960-65, don't have as much notoriety but have a place in the world of RVs. A year after its introduction in 1960, the Corvair line grew appreciably from just a two-door and four-door sedan to include a wagon, a van and a pickup. The Wagon was called the Lakewood in it's inaugural year and the van was available as the Corvan, a cargo van, and the Greenbrier, a passenger van. The Pickups also had two variants, the Rampside which had a big ramp on the side and the Loadside, which did not.

Almost immediately companies jumped on the bandwagon to offer camper kits for the Corvan and Greenbrier and drop-in campers for the Rampside pickups. Chevrolet also offered camper kits the dealer could install in the Greenbrier van, which included a bed that covered the rear-mounted engine and various forms of a kitchen

depending on the year. For '61, they offered a dealer-installed camper kit for \$485 in their "Complete Guide to Custom Features for the Chevy Corvair Greenbrier Sports Wagon." The camper kit consisted of a sofa that stretched from behind the driver's seat back to the engine compartment along the long driver's side wall in the passenger area. This sofa could be converted into two single beds or a double bed with the help of a bolster cushion. Under-sofa drawers supplied storage space as did two cabinets over the rear wheels, one with provisions for hanging clothes and the other with shelves for food storage. The area over the engine was



reserved for loose Coleman accessories such as a #5402-731 Picnic Stove, a 7 gallon Coleman Cooler, a 1 gallon Coleman drink jug and a kitchen counter with a silverware tray. Curtains were included for complete privacy, when camping, as well as many other custom features. There were also a shelter kit (like an awning), window screens, luggage rack, table and under-seat drawer.

From 1961-65, the car top sleeper accessory was 6 1/2 feet x 4 feet and 33" high, when extended. It featured a 1/4" plywood base that had enough room for either a 3/4 size double mattress or two 24" x 72" air mattresses, which could actually remain in place when the unit was folded down for driving. The unit was fastened to the roof via the drip rails and also suction cups and came with a folding ladder. ... Continued on next page

From 1963-64, there was a revised dealer-installed kit from Chevrolet, which was \$595 but included a full-width kitchen counter behind the front bench seat. This large cabinet included a place for a seven-gallon Coleman Station Wagon icebox, a working sink, a silverware drawer and additional storage. There was also a skinny cabinet, which ran along the side of the van that provided hanging clothes storage along with sliding doors at the back for additional storage. Other manufacturers made camper kits for both the Corvan and Greenbrier along with drop-in campers for the Rampside. Interestingly the drop-in campers for the Rampside pickup generally had you take the big ramp off and used that space for a door into the camper but you don't see many of them nowadays.





D&D RESTORATION TOUR

Our April activity was our yearly tour of D & D Classic Restorations in Covington, Ohio. Our caravan to D & D from the Meijer's store consisted of one Corvair and 3 other cars. Greg Hanlin had his white Greenbriar out of winter storage and led the group to Covington.

As usual we had another interesting tour of the D & D led by our familiar tour guide Mike Ison. Mike stated that the shop now has 70 cars either being work on or maintained by a staff of 25 employees. They have 50,000 sq ft of building spaces. According to Mike, people restore their cars because of family remembrance, cars of their youth, unique cars and other reasons, but usually not for profit. Mike says that of the 70 cars only 2 are or will be worth more than the cost of restoration. It reminds the writer of the old joke about racing. "If one wants to end up with a small fortune in auto racing you start with a large fortune"

In addition to cars we saw three airplanes under restoration. It may seem odd at first hand that they had planes there, but they were there for metal work on the fuselages. Metal work is necessary for restoring old cars as some parts need to be fabricated by hand. We were able to see a performance of this type of work in person on a Yoder power hammer while we were there. The planes get aluminum work while most, but not all, cars are done in steel. This type of work is a learned skill. The planes get a special aluminum that is hard and springy and is more difficult to form.

Examples of the cars, planes, and engines that were there included: 1936 Holden (a 1936 right hand Chevy sent to Australia in a crate, assembled there, and had a Holden badge attached to it), 63 Ford Galaxie 500 convertible, 69 Camaro Pace Car front frame, 63 red split window Corvette coupe (to get running), Lincoln Zepher V-12 (they examined 3 blocks to get a good one for this car), 41 Ford light green sedan, 32 Ford coupe (for a modern Chevy LS engine), 1931 red/gray Pierce Arrow, a 1924 wire loom machine that can color duplicate old vehicle electrical wiring.

In the next building we saw a black 1941 Packard Le Baron, 1928 Rolls Royce Phantom 1, 1938 Austrian Styre 220 (one of two remaining out of only six made), 1959 Osca, a DeTomaso body (a pre Ford Pantera prototype), another Rolls Royce with a special body, 1930's Auburn, 1936 Plymouth, Valle Lunga DeTomaso mid engine poster car. 2008 Bullet Mustang (named after the earlier Mustang Steve McQueen drove in the famous movie car chase), 1928 Isoto Fraschini that is maintained at D & D (it has been there for years and was originally driven by movie star Margarita Clark).

In the next building, the body shop, we saw a 1969 Chevelle coupe, 1919 Detroit Electric steered by levers, 1940 Lincoln Continental coupe, 1956 Corvette with a dual quad engine, 1930 Graham sedan, 1966 Ford Mustang coupe, a boat tail Auburn roadster, 1935 Bentley, Yoder power hammer and an English wheel, and three airplanes including a Lockheed Altair, 1930's Aero Commander, and a home built plane to be finished.

After the D & D tour we headed over to Buffalo Jack's for lunch in their group room having to negotiate some downtown road construction to get there.

RUSTY METAL ON THE CORVAIR WINDSHIELD CHANNEL

Late model Corvairs are notorious for rust in the windshield channel at the bottom of the windshield. Clark's sells a repair part to fix this problem. A poster on Corvair Center says that the part does not fit that well, but with a little messaging, a little heat, and a little hammering the part can be made to fit well. Clark's says that this is a difficult part to install and is 2" short on the ends because the stock part is part of the fenders. This is Clark's part number C 641XR. Cost is \$159.55. Probably welded on.

DIFFERENTIAL AND AXLE FLUID LEVEL

According to several knowledgeable posters on Corvair Center the ideal level is about ½ inch below the fill holes on the transmission and also on the axle. Another poster says the easy way to measure the ½ inch is to stick your finger in the hole to the first knuckle, bend your finger down to the lube and the ideal level will just touch your finger tip. Most people fill until it just runs out of the fill hole.

Directions to the club meeting at:

Vandalia Justice Center -

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. Note: The room is on the west side of the building. If some of the club members are already there you may be able to enter through the side door to the room. They can let you in or may have the door blocked open.

Vandalia Historical Society Meeting House/Shelter -It is only 2 minutes from the Justice Center. It is located at 336 East Alkaline Springs Road. From the Justice Center (or I-75) drive west on National Road to the Dixie Drive Highway intersection. Turn left (south) onto Dixie Drive and continue on Dixie to the stoplight at Elva Court then continue on Dixie to the next street on your left (just past the Vandalia-Butler High School), and turn left (east) onto East Alkaline Springs Road. You will see the City Art Park on your right and just past the park is a long wood picket fence in front of the Society property. Turn right into the driveway and drive back around the barn to the parking area and the Meeting House / Shelter. There are restrooms in the Meeting House if needed. It would be a good idea to bring your mask for that additional step of protection.
