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HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This article is about a book written by Karl E. Ludvigsen titled *"Corvair by Chevrolet: Experimental & Production Cars 1957-1969"* published November 24, 2001. Also, an online link to a nice article about "Remembering the Great Design of the Chevrolet Monza GT by Robert Tate, automotive historian and researcher, with images courtesy of the Robert Tate Collection published Dec 12, 2014.



The book review says the Corvair is ,,, one of the most controversial cars ever made, Chevrolet's Corvair is celebrated in this unique pictorial history. From his files on the Corvair - which he first road-tested in 1959 - Karl Ludvigsen presents a plethora of photos of the original 'Holden' prototypes on test and even a Corvair engine installed in a Porsche, its first running test bed.

Photos of the production

Corvairs down through the years are interspersed with wild and woolly prototypes and concept cars based on this unique rear-engined auto, the one whose unusual handling helped make Ralph Nader famous. Ludvigsen, who worked at GM during much of the Corvair era from 1960 to 1969, reveals styling models and describes his own

involvement with one of the handsomest sports prototypes ever designed, the Corvair Monza GT. It is a feast for fans of the novel and endearing Corvair.

Wikipedia.org says "Karl Ludvigsen (born 24 April 1934, Kalamazoo, Michigan). Cum Laude graduate of Phillips Exeter Academy and attended both the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, studying engineering, and Pratt Institute where he matriculated in industrial design. In 1958–59 he served in the US Army Signal Corps in West Germany. Ludvigsen is best known for his work over 50 years as a journalist, author and historian. Ludvigsen began his automotive writing and editing for MIT's Tech Engineering News in 1953. He has served as technical editor of both Auto Age and Sports Cars Illustrated, east coast editor of Motor Trend and editor of Car and Driver. Currently he writes for Automobile Quarterly, The Automobile and Hemmings Sports & Exotic Cars, among



others, plus various one-make periodicals and leading website publications Winding Road and Just-Auto.com." Credits: Google search "Corvair by Chevrolet: Experimental & Production Cars"

Former Corvair club member John Manes has sold his restored early Corvair sedan and was there with a 1991 Nissan Figaro 2 seat convertible. The car is powered by a 4 cylinder 995 cc turbo charged engine coupled to an automatic transmission. The car's options include A/C.

WINDSHIELD CHIP REPAIR

Your co-editor has had good success with a "VersaChem" repair kit by Illinois Tool Works of Solon, Ohio. The kit which is a one time use will repair a windshield chip of up to 1.25" in diameter. It is a twelve step process but they are easy to follow. The process involves sucking the air out of the chip and injecting clear resin into the chip and crack area. This is all done with the tool that comes in the kit and has an adhesive coated pedestal that is attached to the windshield over the chip. A plunger is attached to the pedestal to remove air and inject the resin filler. Just be sure to keep the spring on the plunger in place. It pops off pretty easy. Do this on a sunny day as the resin is cured by the UV rays from the sun. The kit was purchased at Advance Auto Parts.

SPARK PROBLEMS

Is your Corvair not running as well as in the past? Pull a plug wire and hold it close to a ground. Corvair Center poster and Corvair mechanic, Ken Hand, says that you want a blue spark. An orange spark is a sign of a poor coil or condensor.

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Directions to the club meeting

This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher.
