**Welcome**: President Shawn Funkhouser welcomed all and we had a short discussion about Shawn and Gary working on a Corvair that once belonged to Jack Milliff. Shawn also mentioned we are still in need of a Vice President. Shawn indicated he was open for old, new or other business on the agenda after we finish our normal reports.

**Secretary**: Joe reviewed important items from the February minutes as reported in the March newsletter. Joe also mentioned he had several updates to discuss during the old/new business portions of the meeting, Gary motioned the minutes be accepted as reviewed, second by Paul and approved.

**Treasurer**: Jennie first reviewed the 2020 year-end report. Our balance at the end of 2020 was \$2,199.88.

On February 23 we had a balance of \$2,199.93 with income from Membership of \$156 (Duane Baker, Wes Bogner, Kevin Clark, Gary Funkhouser, Shawn Funkhouser, Greg Hanlin, John Hawkins, Kevin McGillivray, Verle McGillivray, James Schmidt, Doug Simon, Jim Stukenborg), 50/50 of \$8.50, 50/50 donated by Shawn of \$8.50, and checking interest of \$.03 for a total of \$173.03. Our expenses were Mustang Museum donation of \$50, memorial donation for Aggie of \$100, memorial donation for Ray Petty of \$50 and support donation to Christy's restaurant of \$50 for a total of \$250. The balance on March 23, 2021 was \$2,122.96 A motion by Paul, seconded by Gary and approved to accept both reports.

#### HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting, we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This newsletter article was written by Paul Duchene March 26, 2018 for Hagerty.com. Hagerty exists for people who love cars. From insurance for your classic car, truck, motorcycle, or tractor to valuation tools, rentals and resources.

#### WHY ISN'T THE 1960-69 CHEVROLET CORVAIR WORTH MORE?

The article indicates the Corvair was designed to combat the Volkswagen Beetle and, on your point of view, was either one of the most creative or most foolhardy steps in the history of the U.S. auto industry. It explains how, with 1,839,439 sold over 10 years, the Corvair was hardly a failure. Today, the Corvair provides one of the least expensive opportunities into the U.S. collector car world and the best convertibles seldom surpass \$25,000. Also, Corvairs are relatively easy to fix with a reliable parts supply and are common outside the Rust Belt. So why aren't they worth more?

The article provides a short history of the Corvair, explains the role of Chief Engineer Ed Cole and lists the 500, 700, Monza, Corvan, Greenbrier, Lakewood, Rampside and Spyder models. In 1961, when Ed Cole was "kicked upstairs" to head the GM car and truck group, the Corvair lost its driving force and, despite Corvair-based concept cars like the Sebring Spyder, Monza GT, Astro 1, and John Fitch's Phoenix, resources were redirected to conventional models.

The article refers often to Larry Claypool, as a lifelong Corvair aficionado and technical editor for the national club magazine for 25 years., and lists several factors



Larry felt impacted the Corvair's acceptance. Larry was quoted as saying ""It's still a niche vehicle, not a mainstream Chevy. There were lots of them, but it's unconventional, with an air-cooled rear engine and limited performance potential. Even turbocharged, the hottest stock Corvair performed like a base V-8 of the day." Larry also noted that once Ed Cole was gone, the Corvair was an orphan. "Most dealers might have one junior mechanic who worked on them. If he was off, they'd tell you to schedule an appointment later. As an economy car, many were not wellmaintained." Larry also noted that "spares were common through the 1980s, even at dealers, but body parts have dried up. Doors, trunks and hoods can be found, but everything else is welded together, making replacement pretty expensive. While mechanical parts are available, a Corvair owner needs to know "the guy" nearby who can work on his/her car—or be handy themselves. There are a lot of hands-on owners, but probably only a dozen Corvair specialists in the country. With prices low there's little incentive to specialize. In most places it's easier to get a Ferrari correctly repaired."

The article refers to Larry's expertise and opinion often as it indicates, partly due to low values, numerous barn finds survive and are easy to revive in rust-free zones. Running coupes and sedans can be found under \$1,500, but don't expect any investment appreciation. Convertibles can be found for \$12,000-\$15,000, but rusty projects may be uneconomical to fix. Larry thinks the 1965-66 Corsa coupe and convertible have the brightest future, with only 27,621 hardtops and 11,495 convertibles built.

In conclusion, the article quotes Larry again saying "A lot of major collectors now have a Corvair, and in the last five years people have been looking for these. You're much better off paying \$25,000 for a good, fully sorted one, than buying a project for \$2,000 and putting \$50,000 into it." See the link below for the full article.

#### **HEADLIGHT BULBS**

A poster ("66 vairman") on Corvair Center reviewed a problem with today's headlight replacements. He says to take your old bulb with you and check to see if the lines in the glass front line up correctly. Per his instruction go counter clockwise on the front of the bulb to the first aiming protrusion. On the rear of the bulb is a resting pad that should line up with the front protrusion. If the front protrusion and the rear pad do not line up the front lens lines will not be verticle and perpendicular to the other headlights. Seems to be one of the common problems with today's foreign made parts.

#### FC DOOR HOLDER

In an answer to a poster's question on Corvair Center, Phil Daly responded that the Corvair FC door holder is the same part that is used on Chevy and GMC trucks from 1960 to 1966. This part is available from LMC truck.

Go to www.lmc.com. Then go to select vehicle, click shop parts, click door components, look for picture of the door parts with the holder and hinges. The holder is component # 5.

### Directions to the club meeting at:

#### Vandalia Justice Center -

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. Note: The room is on the west side of the building. If some of the club members are already there you may be able to enter through the side door to the room. They can let you in or may have the door blocked open.

Vandalia Historical Society Meeting House/Shelter -It is only 2 minutes from the Justice Center. It is located at 336 East Alkaline Springs Road. From the Justice Center (or I-75) drive west on National Road to the Dixie Drive Highway intersection. Turn left (south) onto Dixie Drive and continue on Dixie to the stoplight at Elva Court then continue on Dixie to the next street on your left (just past the Vandalia-Butler High School), and turn left (east) onto East Alkaline Springs Road. You will see the City Art Park on your right and just past the park is a long wood picket fence in front of the Society property. Turn right into the driveway and drive back around the barn to the parking area and the Meeting House / Shelter. There are restrooms in the Meeting House if needed. It would be a good idea to bring your mask for that additional step of protection.
