They let us use the Party Room and we had a good attendance getting out after COVID - Jennie & Joe Dranschak, Glenda & Mike Bayman, Colin Bayman, Darcy & Duane Baker, Kevin Clark, Paul Huelskamp, Mary Ann Morris, Verle McGillivray, Jim Schmidt, Lois & Don Bigler, Gary Funkhouser and Shawn Funkhouser. We turned in our pizza order and people were busy talking so we just waited for the pizza and ate. Club President Shawn Funkhouser called the meeting to order after we ate.

Vice President Comments: We are still looking for a Vice President.

Secretary: Joe Dranschak had a little ink problem with his printer so he did not have the latest minutes copy posted in the latest Newsletter. However, Joe motioned that the Newsletter minutes be approved with a second by Verle and approved.

Treasurer: Jennie Dranschak reported a beginning balance of \$2,190.97. We had income of \$10 from the 50/50 and a \$5 donation from Daryl Smith for half of his 50/50 winnings and \$40 from sale of 2 hats for a total income of \$55. Activities: Don & Lois Bigler introduced themselves and shared information about their Corvair. Kevin Clark reviewed some of the scheduled activities especially the Mid Ohio Meet planned for June 12. We also talked a little about the Wings & Wheels Fly In at Zanesville on August 14. We also talked about the Dayton Concours d'Elegance on Sunday, September 19, 10:30am-4PM, with each admission including full access to all of the buildings and exhibits of Carillon Historical Park, as well as a souvenir event program. Cost is \$25 for adults (\$20 if purchased in advance), \$10 for children ages 3-17,

and FREE to Dayton History members and children under 3. Kevin noted that he only has 6 of the new Club hats left.

HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This article is from the website https://bensbus.weebly.com where you can find out much more than what is in this condensed article. This is part two of our article from our previous Newsletter.

CORVAIR FORWARD CONTROL FACTS

The Chevrolet Motor Company built and marketed the Corvair Forward Control line of trucks and vans between 1961 and 1965. The Corvair 95 line consisted of two vans, the nine passenger people-moving Greenbrier and the windowless Corvan for cargo, and two pickup trucks, one with a side loading ramp called a Rampside and one without a ramp called a Loadside. Features such as a rear engine and low load floor made the Corvair FC trucks unique to all other light delivery and work trucks built during the 1960s. Unfortunately, it was this uniqueness that turned many people away from them in search of a more conventional van or pickup truck.

GREENBRIER (Model R-1206) These windowed vans were produced from 1961-1965 outlasting all other models of Chevrolet's Forward Control light duty truck offerings. Greenbriers could be ordered with standard interior and body trim or with a "Deluxe" package which included such things as a sun visor for the passenger, chrome bumpers, hubcaps, and windshield trim, windshield washing equipment, padded interior panels, and special reflector panels situated beside the taillight housings. Deluxe features for Greenbriers and the other FCs have become highly sought after and seldom well reproduced. If buying a Deluxe Greenbrier, you should be sure that the truck is as complete as possible as replacing missing deluxe accessories may be difficult and expensive. Optional extras included driver side intermediate cargo doors (designating a Greenbrier so equipped as an "Eight Door"), a third bench seat, making it a nine passenger model, as well as several offerings from the dealer to fully or partially equip the van as a camper able to serve a family of four for weekends or long vacations. Window screens were included with the camper kits and were used in conjunction with one of the Greenbrier's most ingenious features, four roll down rear windows in addition to the two front door windows that offered full ventilation on a hot day.

CORVAN (Model R-1205) These vans were basically Greenbriers without side windows and were produced from 1961-1964. Almost always bought in standard trim, Corvans had few frills unless requested by the customer. In fact, from the factory, these vans had only a driver's side sun visor and a single seat for the driver. An optional passenger "bucket" seat was available at extra cost as was a full width bench seat. As most customers opted for the bench seat, Corvan split bench (bucket) seats are rare nowadays. Almost all of the deluxe trim options available for the Greenbrier were also available for the Corvan. At one point in the Corvan's production, even the glove-box door and the rear cargo door windows were deleted to save costs. These rear windows became an optional accessory.

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HISTORY HAPPENS...continued

RAMPSIDE (Model R-1254) Among the most unique vehicles ever to hit the American Roadways, Rampside pickup trucks were produced from 1961-1964. Offered as a light duty truck with a 3/4 ton payload, these trucks were built to work. The passenger side of the bed lowered to the ground to provide a ramp for easy loading of bulky or heavy items such as refrigerators, washers and dryers, and lawn mowers. A rubber strip was positioned on the top of the ramp to keep it from becoming damaged by the surface it was lowered upon. Used hard by businesses and individuals, very few nice unrestored examples exist today. A level load floor option was available from the dealer to take away the "stepped" bed necessitated by the rear engine location, but it almost completely negated the ramp idea when in use. Rampsides also included a tailgate for rear loading.

LOADSIDE (Model R-1244) Considered by some Corvair enthusiasts as the most useless of the Forward Control truck line, the Loadside pickup truck was only produced from 1961-1962. It was similar to the Rampside in all aspects except for the lack of a side ramp. This made loading items into the deep bed of the pickup truck nearly impossible. The addition of a level load floor option made the truck easier to use, however it made about a third of the total loadable space completely unusable. This light duty Forward Control never caught the consumer's attention. Only 369 Loadsides were produced in 1962 making it the rarest Corvair produced in America.

CARBURETOR ACCELERATOR PUMP TIP

Poster Dave Motohead on Corvair Center uses the cap from a ball point pen to aid in sliding the accelerator pump cup into place with out damage to the new part.

DOOR KNOB LOCK **GROMMET**





The grommets around the door lock knob get brittle and crack after 50 plus years. Replacing them requires care as they are fragile. There is a little nit on the grommet and this should be lined up with a small notch in the door sheet metal so they don't rotate. One can also soak the grommet in hot water to soften it a little and can also use a little WD-40 to lube it. They are available from Clark's. Check door parts. Clark's suggests if you need two, buy three, because they are fragile and you are probably going to break one. This was another post on Corvair Center.

Directions to the club meeting at:

Vandalia Justice Center -

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. Note: The room is on the west side of the building. If some of the club members are already there you may be able to enter through the side door to the room. They can let you in or may have the door blocked open.

Vandalia Historical Society Meeting House/Shelter -It is only 2 minutes from the Justice Center. It is located at 336 East Alkaline Springs Road. From the Justice Center (or I-75) drive west on National Road to the Dixie Drive Highway intersection. Turn left (south) onto Dixie Drive and continue on Dixie to the stoplight at Elva Court then continue on Dixie to the next street on your left (just past the Vandalia-Butler High School), and turn left (east) onto East Alkaline Springs Road. You will see the City Art Park on your right and just past the park is a long wood picket fence in front of the Society property. Turn right into the driveway and drive back around the barn to the parking area and the Meeting House / Shelter. There are restrooms in the Meeting House if needed. It would be a good idea to bring your mask for that additional step of protection.
