FEBRUARY MEETING MINUTES

HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This article is about the 1955 GMC L'Universelle concept model. A Google search shows about 2,850 results to view.

The 1955 GMC L'Universelle show van was a General Motors design concept model designed under the direction of Harley Earl. The name "L'Universelle" is French and means "The Universal." It was unveiled in 1955 to highlight forward thinking in the area of delivery vehicles. The futuristic styling influenced design in the 1960s with the first compact passenger van from Chevrolet, which was built on a Corvair chassis.

In January 1955, GM debuted its 1955 L'Universelle show van at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York, at the opening of the Motorama. Though not a conventional "dream car" it shared the same level of innovation as the one-offs displayed by GM's other divisions. The bronze-colored van shared many of the same Harley Earl-inspired design elements used on both production and non-production GM cars of the time.



Quite a lot of versatility was designed into the L'Universelle and it was speculated, in GMC-generated literature, that minor manufacturing changes could turn the van into a small bus, taxi, station wagon or sportsman's car.

After the 1955 Motorama stops in New York, Miami, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Boston, GM also showed GMC's L'Universelle in Chicago at the Powerama, a one-time-only outdoor event similar in concept to the Motorama. The focus of the Powerama was not automobiles, but rather the products and services of GM's non-automotive divisions. GMC was especially well represented, with their diesel trucks and of course, the GMC Dream Truck. Though attended by millions of people between August 31 and September 25, 1955, the Powerama was not moved to any other cities and was never held again.

Though half a century has passed since GMC's L'Universelle graced a Motorama turntable, it accurately predicted the dimensions, layout and packaging of the minivans that have become a staple of American life. Closer to its own era, it also influenced the design of Chevy's rear-engined Series 95 trucks, the Corvair Rampside and Loadside pickups, Greenbrier vans, and Corvans. It's really too bad that this is yet another dream machine that disappeared without a trace.

CORVAIR OUTSIDE MIRRORS

Per J. Johnson, a poster on Corvair Center, a Burco #3027 right side mirror glass for a 1981 Dodge Omni, or Aspen, and Plymouth Horizon fits over the glass or can be used as a replacement for a Corvair outside mirror. Google Burco auto mirror glass to follow up on this tip.

TURBO DISTRIBUTORS

If you have a 1962 through 1966 turbocharged Corvair you have a pressure retard distributor. This helps prevent detonation under high boost. So if your car just will not run correctly at higher speeds make sure that you have the correct distributor for a normally aspirated or a turbo motor. The part numbers for the three different turbo distributors are as follows:

1962--63-----1110290

1964-----1110314

1965--66-----1110329

PS. If you have one of the turbo distributors in your parts bin it will be more valuable than a regular distributor.

Directions to the club meeting
