
free parking at the restaurant.

JANUARY MEETING MINUTES

Our January meeting took place on Tuesday Jan 27. The meeting was called to order at 6:45 PM.

Those in attendance included Joe Dranschak, Kevin Clark, Jim Schmidt, Jim Stukenborg, Jack Milliff, Gary Funkhouser, Shawn Funkhouser, Aggie Moyer, Bernice Noll, Paul Huelskamp, and new member Wes Bogner.

Joe Dranschak conducted the meeting as of the start of the meeting we had not filled the vacated president's position. Vice president Steve Kianka was not feeling well so he was not at the meeting.

Joe reviewed the minutes of the November and December (at the Christmas party) meetings. The minutes as printed in the newsletter were approved as read. Motion to accept by Jack Milliff, seconded by Gary Funkhouser.

Joe read Jennie Dranschak's treasurer's report. Our year end report shows that we had \$2427.28 in our treasury.

For January we had a membership income of \$12 and expenses of \$26.41 for the planning meeting resulting in an ending balance in January of \$2412.87. A motion to accept by Paul Huelskamp and a second by Kevin Clark.

HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." This information is from a 2009 Chicago Tribune article by Paul Duchene originally provided by Corvair Preservation Foundation historian Dave Newell and technical adviser Larry Claypool to celebrate the 50-year anniversary of the Corvair. We will share this article in two parts between the January and February Club Newsletters. Part two is for items 13-25.

Twenty-Five Things You Didn't Know About The Corvair

- 13. GM built several front-wheel-drive prototypes in 1961, based on Alfa Romeo 1900 and Renault Caravelle platforms; a four-wheel-drive Corvan was tested.
- One of the rarest Corvairs is the 1962 Loadside pickup. Only 369 were made, with a well in the center of the 14. floor that could not be swept out.
- The Corvair was an enormously popular base for show cars: the 1961 Sebring Spyder and Pininfarina 15. Speciale, 1962 Super Spyder and Bertone Testudo, 1963 Monza GT and SS, 1966 Fitch Phoenix, 1967 Astro 1 survive.
- 16. A radical 1965 redesign with Fisher Z body saw the rear suspension resemble Corvette's to address safety issues (see "Unsafe at Any Speed"). And the heater and A/C were improved. But without the pop of the V-8 Ford Mustang, sales dwindled and opened the door to the Panther (Camaro).
- Don Yenko extracted up to 240 h.p. from Yenko Stinger Corvairs, which were competitive Sports Car Club of 17. America racers. He built 100 in one month in 1965, with a total of 185 from 1965-67.
- 18. In 1968, XP-892 was shown as a full-size model for the 3rd-generation Corvair, planned for 1970, but scrapped. However, the 1974 Holden Monaro HJ coupe borrowed some styling cues.
- 19. Corvair was down to two coupes and a convertible for 1968-69. A/C was discontinued because of the engine load added by an emissions air pump.
- Modular Corvair engines were built to bolt together in 4-, 8- and 10-cylinder configurations. One, a 20. 10-cylinder front-wheel-drive configuration, was used in the development of the Olds Toronado.
- 21. The rarest Corvair is the amphibious Corphibian Loadside pickup. One was built. The GM plant in Oshawa, Ontario, built 100 amphibious Corvair Dynatrack articulated vehicles for the U.S. and Canadian Armies. The Australian Army ordered 500 but didn't have the money upfront.
- 22. Apollo astronauts trained on a Corvair-based lunar rover in New Mexico.
- 23. The last Corvair was VIN:105379W106000, an Olympic Gold 1969 coupe with black interior. It's reported to have been destroyed, but ...
- In the 1970s, Viton finally made a rubber seal that resisted the heat around Corvair pushrods and cured the 24. oil leaks that had plagued the cars since they were new.
- By 1971, the National Highway Safety Transportation Board declared the Corvair no less safe than anything 25. else on the road in the early 1960s. Take that, Ralph Nader (the consumer crusader who made his name in 1965 with "Unsafe at Any Speed," the book that targeted Corvair).







LONGEST CORVAIR

This modified Corvair truck looks like it is longer than the Cincinnati club Corvair limo that belonged to Don Filkens. It



looks like a pretty neat vehicle. It is called a Corvadillac as it is powered by a 1996 Cadillac Northstar V8 engine with a four speed automatic transmission. The tag axle is also from the Cadillac.




TECH TIPS

CORVAIR DOOR WILL NOT OPEN

There is a plastic part on the door latch that can break over time like the 51+ years since our Corvairs were made. The bad news is that this small broken piece can lodge in the latch mechanism and jam it so that the door can't be opened. The solution is to have someone pull on the door handle while pushing in the handle button on the outside and someone else beat on the door near the latch until the piece is dislodged. To prevent damage to the door place a two by four over the back edge of the door panel on the inside and pound on the two by four. Sooner or later the broken piece will fall into the bottom of the door allowing the door to open. The door will operate normally after that. The broken piece of plastic in the latch is pictured at the right.



WHAT WAS THAT CAR MODEL?

Ever wonder about a car model. When was it made. How many models of a particular brand were made during a particular year? What engine did it have? Go to Rockauto.com. They list about every model car ever made. For example a 1940 Buick. There were seven models: Century series 60, limited series 80 and 90, Roadmaster series 70 and 80, Special 40, a Super Series 50, and two straight eight engines, a 248 CI and a 320 CI.

How about a 1933 Reo. There were two models, Flying Cloud and Royale and 2 engines, a straight six and a straight eight.



Directions to the club meeting

Coming from the east the Justice Center is just down the side road from the Wendy's restaurant that is located on Rt-40 just west of the Vandalia exit from I-70. This side road at Wendy's is James Bohanan Dr. The street address of the justice center is 245 Bohanan Dr. From the west turn left at the BP station turn right on J.E. Bohanan Dr. The Justice Center door is on the east side of the building. Go in the side door and through the door to the dispatch center. The meeting room is to the left past the dispatcher. A public parking lot is available at the corner of James E. Bohanon Dr. and Maple St. behind the bank and some street parking is available. The parking lot next to the justice center side door is short term during the day. We don't know about availability in the evening. Note: The room is on the west side of the building.
