JANUARY MEETING MINUTES

Minutes: Dayton Corvair Club, 01/27/2019 Club Planning Meeting, 2PM

Location: Marion's Piazza, 3443 N. Dixie Dr., Dayton, Ohio.



Attendees: Jim Stukenborg, Joe & Jennie Dranschak, Greg Hanlin, Aggie Moyer, Bernice Noll, Verle McGillivray, Don & Lois Bigler, Jim Schmidt, Kevin Clark and Jack Milliff. We turned in an order for three pizzas and Verle called the planning meeting to order.

Secretary: The December Dinner meeting minutes were posted in the January newsletter so Joe asked they be approved as written. Motion by Greg Hanlin, second by Lois Bigler and approved to accept the minutes.

Treasurer: Aggie did her final report for Dec. 8 through December 31, 2018. We had an opening balance of \$1,936.54 with income of \$643.50 from the Christmas dinner, \$279 from membership dues, \$33 from the 50/50 and another \$33 from Willa Smith donating her 50/50 winnings to the pizza fund. We also had \$50 for parts and a donation of \$20 from Lois Bigler and another \$24 from Corvair parts Jerry Fritz donated to us. This was a total income of \$1,087.50. Our expenses were \$682.50 to Christy's Restaurant for 35 dinners at \$19.50 each, minus our \$100 deposit, which amounted to \$582.50 in expenses. This left us a balance on December 31, 2018 of \$2,436.54. A motion by Lois, seconded by Greg and approved to accept Aggie's final report. NOTE: We did not need to give Christy's a \$100 deposit for the Dec 14, 2019 dinner reservation. Jennie gave an update on the status of the new checking account at Monroe Federal Savings in Vandalia. Jennie, Greg and Verle will be the authorized signers of the checking account.

Membership: Greg Hanlin was present but we had no new membership business.

Newsletter: Jim Stukenborg and Kevin Clark were present but we had no new Newsletter business.

Activities: This planning meeting was the main purpose of meeting at Marion's Piazza so we might have a few more attendees and we did. Joe passed out a draft calendar of events for 2019 for discussion. We went through each month and discussed activities or events that were or might be assigned to each month. Greg will check with the Dayton Dragons for a May game for us to attend and order 20 tickets. Joe will check with D&D Classic for a date for our annual tour in April and confirm a lunch reservation with Buffalo Jacks. Kevin will check with Cincinnati to find out when they plan on hosting the Mid Ohio Meet. Jim will check with Gary to see if he wants to host another Tech Session in September.

DID CORVAIR RACE AT THE 24 HR LE MANS?

While trolling the internet your editor came across the 24 hr LeMons race run here in the US. Don't confuse this with the 24 hr Le Mans race in France. For those not familiar with the LeMons race, it is a race run with cars supposedly costing no more than \$500. Some liberties are taken with this expenditure limit. The rules are quite



extensive and are entertaining to read. There has been at least one Corvair to take up the LeMons challenge. The Corvair named Tom's Fault is actually a mid engine Corvair powered by a 350 Chevy engine. It was reported to have run for 24 hours without any spinouts. Google 24 Hr LeMons race to read the rules. Five hundred dollars sounds a little low for a mid engine Corvair. Maybe I'll claim that car. Wonder if you need to be entered to claim?

Now to get serious, Google has no info about Corvairs at Le Mans. It has a lot of info on drivers like John Fitch of

Corvair fame. John did his racing with Mercedes Benz not with a Corvair. One might have thought that the Corvair Yenko Stinger would have been a car for Le Mans racing consideration. Probably an expensive proposition to race at Le Mans. Not for the poor mans Porsche?

GM management was interested in generating Corvair interest in Europe and sent several Corvair chassis over there to a couple of the well known foreign designers who did generate two examples of their ideas for the car. One of these was the 1963 Corvair Testudo. The other was a design by Pinin Farina that was much more late model. Maybe next month we can get Joe Dranschak to do his history article on this subject.

HISTORY HAPPENS

At our February, 2016 Club meeting we decided we would add a history article to our newsletter under the heading "History Happens." Dan Jedlicka created the article "1960-69 Chevrolet Corvair History," which we will share over three newsletters. This is Part 3.

The Corsa came as a \$2,519 coupe or \$2,665 convertible and had the Monza Spyder's sporty brushed aluminum dashboard with sports car instrumentation, upscale interior and special exterior accents. It also featured a sports suspension, larger brakes and quicker steering. The turbo engine was only an extra \$158. But the first highly publicized Ford Mustang arrived in mid-1964 and took the country by storm. It was essentially just an economy Falcon with a sporty body and gobs of options. But it caused Corvair sales to drop by more than half in 1966.

Most Americans could more easily relate to the Mustang, with its front-mounted V-8 or conventional six-cylinder liquid-cooled engines and traditionally sporty long hood/short-rear design. GM actually sealed the Corvair's fate in April, 1965, with an internal memo that prohibited further significant development work on the car. It wanted a conventional auto to fight the Mustang - the 1967 Chevy Camaro. The Corsa was discontinued in 1967, but the Corvair soldiered on through 1969 as the 500 and higher-line Monza coupe and convertible. GM wanted to sell the car long enough to amortize its tooling. It also likely kept the Corvair around a few more years simply because of its pride.

By 1969, though, in its final year, only 6,000 Corvairs were produced. The figure included 2,717 Monza coupes and a mere 521 Monza convertibles. Corvair national expert Larry Claypool, of the 'Vair Shop in Frankfort, Illinois, says interest in the Corvair continues building, judging by the number brought to his facility to be worked on.

Claypool says many Chevy mechanics disliked working on Corvairs in the 1960s "not because the car was that difficult, it was just different from other Chevrolets." Just between you and me, if you don't want to spend lots of money for a neat collector car, the Corvair is one of the last really affordable ones left. Moreover, the national Corvair club is quite active, and it's no hassle getting parts. Corvair prices are rising, but the car still is very underpriced. For instance, a 1962-64 Monza Spyder coupe in good condition is valued at \$4,500, with the convertible version at \$6,950, says the Cars of Particular Interest value guide. A 1965-66 Corsa coupe in good shape is worth \$5,000, while the convertible is \$7,350.

You can even get a hot competition non-factory, but professionally done, 1966-68 Yenko Stinger Corvair coupe. It came from a well-known East Coast Chevy dealer that specialized in high-performance Chevrolets and won a national racing championship. It's valued at \$20,000 in good condition and at \$42,000 in excellent shape, which are still very low prices in today's collector car market. However, it can be hard to find a good Yenko Stinger, and the car is happiest tearing up race tracks. My choice would be a 1962-64 Monza Spyder or 1965-66 Corsa with the high-torque four-carburetor engine. They're economical to buy and operate, easy to drive in all sorts of weather and just loads of fun.

TECH TIPS

BIG FUSE

Had to check a fuse for the heater motor on a 2010 Chevy Impala. The fused turned out to be a 30 amp for the motor circuit. The size of this fuse was about three times the normal two prong 1/8" thick 1/2" wide fuse. This one was more like a circuit breaker. Roughly 1/2" x 1/2". It did not want to pull out of the fuse panel. Could not visually tell if it was good. On closer examination there was a slight indentation on the side just under the different color top. Using an ice pick it was possible to just pop off the top of the fuse and test for continuity. The pick released a small tab that held the top in place. No fuses like this on our Corvairs though, but it was more convenient to get to under the hood than under the dash as on the Corvair.

FROST ON THE WINDSHIELD

Can't find your scraper, put some winter washer fluid in a spray bottle and spray some on the windshield and on the wiper blades. This also works on the side windows.
